(Do you know that words in Spanish are masculine or feminine?)

Generally, if a word ends in "o" it is masculine and if it ends in "a" it is feminine. There are exceptions to the rule but people will understand you if you forget those exceptions.

Singular		Plural	
the	a	the	some
el (masculine)	un (masculine)	los	unos
la (feminine)	una (feminine)	las	unas

Ejemplos

El niño juega fútbol.

(The boy plays soccer)

La niña juega baloncesto.

(The girl plays basketball)

Un piano está en la iglesia.

(A piano is in the church)

Una bola está en la casa.

(A ball is in the house)

Los hombres juegan golf.

(The men play golf)

Las mujeres juegan vóleybol.

(The women play volleyball)

Unos perros corren.

(Some dogs run)

Unas flores son moradas.

(Some flowers are purple)

Adjetivos

Adjectives agree with the subject of your sentence.

If you are speaking of yourself, your adjective agrees with whatever your gender is

Masculino

El reloj es pequeño.

(The clock is small)

El gato es anaranjado.

(The cat is orange)

El sofá es amarillo.

(The couch is yellow)

Femenino

La mesa es blanca.

(The table is white)

La casa es grande.

(The house is big)

La mano esta fría.

(The hand is cold)
